- Admissions-on-the-Spot: Students planning to attend the U of R but haven't registered yet will want to attend the Admissions-on-the-Spot event on February 12 from 4:00 7:00 pm, at the U of R campus. Students need to bring their certified/unofficial transcript. There will be a discounted application fee of \$70.
- Scholarships SAMS (Student Awards Management System) allows students to search and apply online for the U of R scholarships and awards. The application deadline is March 15.
