Learning to Learn Online express! – Athabasca University (ages 14 – 20 years)

This course will help you through the first leg of your journey as an online learner. It is not at a technical course, although you will get a chance to explore online technologies within the course itself.

Instead, this course will focus on all the things nobody ever told you about online learning: what the whole experience of learning online is really like, the new kinds of relationships you're going to have with your teacher and classmates, and how to keep yourself motivated and moving ahead down the tracks towards your goal. Moving your education online can mean adopting a whole new approach to learning, one with more independence but also more responsibilities in deciding when, where, how and perhaps most importantly, why you're learning online.

LTLO Classic runs **May 25 – June 28** – Designed for **TEACHERS**
