- <u>U-Start Sessions</u> prepare students for their future as a U of S student and are offered throughout the province in the spring.
- There are still programs that are accepting applications for the Fall 2020 semester. Agriculture and Bioresources (June 1 deadline), Edwards School of Business (June 1 deadline), Engineering (June 1 deadline), Arts and Sciences (August 15 deadline)
- Students who complete <u>Saskatchewan Polytechnic's two-year business diploma program can</u> <u>now transfer into the third year of the U of S's four-year Bachelor of Commerce program</u>. Students can also transfer directly into the University of Regina's Business program.
- <u>University summer classes</u> give high school students a head start on their degree program and lighten their load for the upcoming school year. This year these classes will be held remotely, given the current Covid-19 pandemic. Be sure to check with a U of S counsellor to ensure that the course you choose meets your program's requirements. - Students enrolled in the Arts & Science, Agriculture & Bioresources, Engineering, Education and Kinesiology programs can sign up for <u>first-year learning communities</u>. Learning Communities provide students with a sense of belonging and help build leadership skills. These first-year students will register in a common set of 2 or 3 classes and receive weekly assistance from peers and university mentors. Sign-up beginning May 4.
